Working Experience

Ioannis is the Head of Regulatory Framework and Supervisory Technical Assistance in the Department of Insurance Supervision of the Bank of Greece.

Among his current responsibilities are:

- the organization and coordination of thematic supervisory activities for the assessment of implementation of the Solvency II e.g. assessments for Pillar I and II implementation, approval and on-going supervision of internal models, application of transitional measures etc.
- the development and the coordination of execution by the Greek insurers of EIOPA driven exercises and assessments (e.g. stress tests, risk assessments, peer reviews),
- the organization and coordination of market conduct supervisory activities,
- the development of the national regulatory framework for the insurance sector in compliance with the EU legislation (Solvency II Directive, EIOPA guidelines, PEPP, national legislation),

Prior to his current role, he served the Greek insurance supervisory authority in several positions of responsibility, related to the financial and actuarial supervision of insurance undertakings.

Before joining the insurance supervision in 2007, he used to work for an actuarial consulting firm, as a consultant actuary, for 8 years.

Other Experience - positions

He is the Alternate Member of the Bank of Greece to the EIOPA Board of Supervisors since January 2011 and, before this, to the Members' Meetings of CEIOPS since 2008. He is also a member of the EIOPA's Supervisory Solvency Committee since 2018.

He was a member of the Risk and Financial Stability Committee since 2016 and, before this, the Financial Stability Committee since 2012.

During the Greek Presidency in the EU (1st half 2014), he was chairing the Council WP meetings for the trilogue negotiations of EU Regulation for PRIIPs and the Council WP meetings for the proposal for Directive for IORPs II.

He was representing Greece, as national expert, to the negotiations of Solvency II, PEPP and MID at EU level and he was chairing the lawmaking committee for the transposition of Solvency II into the Greek legislation.

He has an actuarial background, designated as a Fellow of the Society of Actuaries of U.S.A. (FSA), a Chartered Enterprise Risk Analyst (CERA) and a Fellow of the Greek Actuarial Society (FHAS).
